# **Adopting God's Heart for the Nations**

- We are blessed to be a blessing to the nations (Genesis 12:2-3)

  "I will bless you and...all the families on earth will be blessed through you."
- God meant for Israel to be a light to the whole world (Jonah, Daniel, Esther and Ezekiel 5:5)
- Peter affirms Abrahams 'blessed to be a blessing to the nations'. (Acts 3:25)
   "...through your descendants (that's us) all the families on earth will be blessed."

Reaching out to every culture isn't just a few people's thing, it's God's thing. If it's God's thing, it's my thing too!

# We start small, we start somewhere we already are, and we start soon.

### 1. Welcoming the Foreigner

- Intentionally find those with least access to Jesus Christ:
   T.H.U.M.B (Tribals, Hindus, Unreligious, Muslim, Buddhist)
- Recognize it's a deeply biblical practice to welcome the foreigner.
   (Deuteronomy 10:18-19, Zechariah 7:10, Ruth 2:11, Matthew 25:5, Matthew 2:13)
   "God shows love to the foreigners living among you and gives them food and clothing. So you, too, must show love to foreigners."
- Befriend International Students and welcome refugees!

Take a thousand small steps of yes in an intentional direction.

### 2. Praying Passionately

- We wrestle, we seek, we listen, we ask God on behalf of those with least access to Jesus Christ. We do it on our knees. (Ephesians 6:12)
  - "For we are not fighting against flesh-and-blood enemies, but against evil rulers and authorities of the unseen world, against mighty powers in this dark world, and against evil spirits in the heavenly places."
- Salt our prayers with strategy by increasing our Missional Intelligence (MQ).
- Prayer moves the heavenlies, but it also moves YOU.

#### 3. Going into All the World

- Go and make disciples (Matthew 28:18-20)

  "Therefore go and make disciples of all the nations..."
- People who go are already welcoming the foreigner and praying passionately.
- When we put kingdom feet on uncharted ground, something happens on earth, as it is in heaven.

## 4. Giving and Sending Generously

- We get a return on our global investment later (Matthew 16:19-21)
  - "...wherever your treasure is, there the desires of your heart will also be."
- Lavish welcome, hospitality, and generosity on your cross-cultural workers.
- 99 out of every 100 dollars given to "missions" in the United States goes to reach peoples and places that already have Christians and churches.

## 5. Mobilizing Inspirationally

- Talk about this to others! (Numbers 10:1-2)
  - "Make two silver trumpets of hammered silver for calling the community to assemble and for signaling the breaking of camp."
- Mobilizers desire to see other people inspired, recruited, trained and released into an important calling.
- We can speak here for those who cannot speak for themselves, those without access to Jesus Christ.

# **DIGGING DEEPER + NEXT STEPS:**

Ways to befriend an international student (from Across the Street and Around the World, page 43-44)

- Sign up to be an international friend at your local university
- Open your home to students for a holiday meal.
- Attend cultural events at a university campus.
- Volunteer to pick up students on arrival.
- Organize fun group events to see sites in your state.
- Be a family away from home, and invite them over when they get lonely.
- Provide transportation to and from the grocery store.
- Participate in (or start) conversational English classes.
- Host a tea party for women in your home.
- Invite them to read the Bible with you!
